Announcement to 2023 Graduating Seniors Alfred & Constance Peyrounat Scholarships Trade/Vocational or Community College

- 1. David & Jessica Swanson & Jennifer Gamble are pleased to announce the Alfred & Constance Peyrounat Scholarships, awarded annually to a graduating high school student committed to higher education and requiring financial assistance.
- 2. Each year scholarship(s) will be awarded to support the completion of certification through an accredited Trade or Vocational School. The basis for the award:
 - a. Academic Achievement
 - b. Financial Need
- 3. The funds will be distributed based on the following:
 - a. The student will receive funds distributed evenly throughout the duration of their specified program, whether it be terms, quarters, semesters, or specific timeframe modules. For each academic year, the dollar amount will be paid in equal installments in August and January.
 - b. If the student withdraws from school for a term, the scholarship will be forfeited.
- 4. Ongoing funding requirements:
 - a. Student must maintain specified academic standards and provide documented evidence each term.
 - b. Deadlines for submittal will be January 15th and July 15th of any given year.
 - c. Requirements for Community College each term:
 - i. Student must maintain a GPA of 2.50 or greater.
 - ii. Student must be a full-time student as defined by the educational institution.
 - iii. Student must provide proof of re-enrollment.
 - iv. Student must provide sealed official transcripts.
 - d. Requirements for Trade/Vocational each term:
 - i. Student must be a full-time student as defined by the Trade/Vocational School.
 - ii. Student must provide proof of ongoing enrollment.
 - iii. Student must provide official transcripts or the equivalent as provided by the school.
- 5. Number of scholarships may vary each year based on available funds.
- 6. By signing student and parent(s) / guardian(s) agree to the terms outlined in this announcement.
- 7. Scholarships must be claimed directly out of high school. No exceptions.
- 8. Application deadline is **March 15th.** Decisions will be announced in May.

- 6. Please describe any awards or honors you have received.
- 7. Please attach the following to your application:
 - Two (2) letters of recommendation from non-family members familiar with your community service and other activities and achievements.
 - A sealed official copy of your high school transcript.
 - The description of your program including the timeframe to completion, cost, and any other grants or scholarships that you have secured.
